The Partitioning of Czechoslovakia (1938 – 1939)

Exhibit Focus

This exhibit presents the stamp issues created for the various Czechoslovak territories from June 18, 1938 to August 31, 1939, encompassing the partitioning period. Postal rates and examples of their use of those issues are also displayed.

Introduction

Czechs and Slovaks were among the several Slavic peoples that sought independence from the Austro-Hungarian Empire at the conclusion of World War 1. During late October 1918, both the Czech and Slovak National Councils decided that their best chance to maintain autonomy and independence was to merge with one another to form the nation of Czechoslovakia.

Nearly 20 years later, the Munich Pact of 30 September 1938, instigated by Germany, initiated the process by which the nation of Czechoslovakia would be fully partitioned within six months. Despite territorial and political limitations, Slovakia chose to declare its independence by 14 March 1939, creating its' first Republic. Germany overran the remaining Czech territory, forming the Bohemia-Moravia Protectorate, while Hungary overran Carpatho-Ukraine within the next two days.
